Interim Pastor's Column --- The Rev. Dr. Gerald (Gerry) C. Hanberry...

I love adventures, especially new adventures in the life of the local church. Indeed, doing something "new" in the local church is exciting in itself; yes, and sometimes a rare occurrence.

Thus, I can say, I am excited about my new work and ministry with you, the people of St. Matthew's UCC, as your interim pastor. Indeed, I have a passion for "doing something new in the name of Christ." And we are doing something new in exploring ways of sharing a pastor amongst two churches without the two churches being in the old-fashioned "two-church charge" mode of operations.

I have served as the interim pastor at Emmanuel (Baust) UCC since September, 2011, on a part-time basis and will join with you at St. Matthew's also on a part-time basis. In effect, I will serve 60% time at Emmanuel (Baust) and 40% time with you. I will be fairly flexible in my schedule during the week but much more structured on Sundays for worship. Basically, 40% time is approximately two days during the week and part of Sunday mornings.

For the period May 5 – September 1, Sunday morning programs will remain at your regular times (SS at 9:30 a.m. and worship at 10:45 a.m.). The folks at Emmanuel (Baust) normally shift from 10:30 a.m. worship to 9:00 a.m. in the summer; therefore, they have decided to make that shift a month earlier than usual so that both churches might coordinate worship in a sequence that will allow for me to lead worship and preach at both Sunday worship services. This minor shift in worship schedule at EBUC allows us all to move into this new adventure with rather limited change during the first four months of my ministry at both churches.

I also have a passion for helping churches be the very best church they can be for the gospel. That is one of my objectives for ministry – to help you be the very best you can be. I also believe it is your work to help me be the best interim pastor I can be. We will explore this shared goal as we work together.

This shared interim pastoral ministry will allow both St. Matthew's and Emmanuel (Baust) churches to explore and experiment with whether and how to share a pastor and even other resources. One of the objectives for this experiment is to increase the pool of potential candidates for your "settled" pastor as you move toward calling a new pastor for the church. This is based on the assumption that two churches, with part-time pastor positions available during the search and call process, and located near each other can increase the pool of candidates for a "full-time" work for a pastor. We will explore this possibility as time goes on.

More importantly, together, you and I will carry out the precious and important ministry of Jesus Christ in your community. We will do this with care and compassion and with honesty and passion. This will be our mutual adventure. And in the words of Philippians 3:14, we will "press on toward the goal for the prize of the heavenly call of God in Christ Jesus."

Interim Search Committee Report

The Interim Search Committee (Ketti Dutterer, Lynn Walter and Donna Geiman) completed its task and the Council has agreed that Pastor Gerry Hanberry will serve St. Matthew's as our part-time interim. Pastor Gerry is not a stranger to some of us, as he served Glade UCC when we teamed up with them for our House Blitz in 2001. Currently, he has retired and is serving as a part time intentional interim at Emmanuel Baust United Church of Christ.

We felt that God was opening up this door for us. Both Baust and St. Matthew's are at about the same place with searching for a part-time pastor. If we search together, the pool of candidates for our new called pastor will be larger. Each church is searching for a part time pastor, together it makes a full time position. As we pondered how this would look, times of worship we thought would be challenging. God opened another door- Baust's Consistory decided to go to their summer schedule in the beginning of May. This gives both congregations several months to work out worship times. As we move forward, let each of us be open to the new possibilities that God has in store for us.

Pastor Hanberry's Approach to and Policy for Pastoral Care

Confidentiality in all communications with people in the church is my policy – always. In other words, **“what is shared with me, stays with me.”**

If a person in the church is ill or in the hospital or going to have surgery, I will always ask, **“what do you want me to share with the church about your illness, your surgery, etc., if anything?”** I, of course, will honor your request and preferences.

Some folks prefer that their illness or a hospital stay be kept private. Others are more open to sharing with the congregation or desire prayers from the church community. I prefer to follow the wishes of the individual or family directly rather than responding to what one might call “hear-say.” Folks in the congregation may share whatever they choose; however, my policy requires that I speak directly with the person or a primary family member before I share news about a person's life circumstances.

Please feel free to contact me at anytime via my cell phone (301-788-6546) to request a visit, to share a health issue or a pastoral care need. Given the flexibility I will have in serving two churches (St. Matthew's and Emmanuel (Baust)), I will be in a good position to respond to your pastoral care needs as they arise.

Memorial Day Service

The traditional Community Memorial Day Service held at Pleasant Valley Cemetery is scheduled for Sunday, May 26th, at 2 p.m. Prior to the service



those who wish may walk the approximate one half mile distance from St. Matthew's Church in Pleasant Valley to the cemetery. The walk will begin promptly at 1:45 p.m. at the church. Walkers are asked to bring flowers to place on the graves. The Pleasant Valley cemetery Association will give participants flags to carry that will be placed on veterans graves. Those who wish may bring lawn chairs for the service.

This service has been held every year for approximately 80 years and was started by the Patriotic Order Sons of American (POS of A). This was a lodge similar to the Elks and Masons and the group was located in Pleasant Valley.

In the 1920's the Pleasant Valley Band was organized at the Pleasant Valley High School and played its first performance at a Memorial Day service. Members from this group later became part of the Wm. F. Myers Band, Westminster, which will provide music at the cemetery as they have for many year.

For the safety of those walking, the Pleasant Valley Fire Company will provide equipment to accompany the walkers and the band.

In case of rain, the service will be held at St. Matthew's Church in Pleasant Valley and the walk will be canceled.

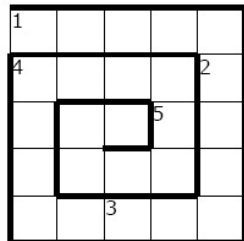

Worship Plan for May 26th - June 30th

Theme: Micah's BIG Question: "What Does the Lord Require of Me?"

The **FUTURE** of the church, any church really, but especially churches in transition like St. Matthew's UCC, is always about **VISION**. Some have discovered that "adopting a simple verse of scripture as a vision statement can be a powerful reality for the church; especially if this verse of scripture is embedded into the mission of the church. Micah 6:8 is one of those powerful verses to seriously consider as the mission of the church, anytime, but especially during a period of transition: *"He has told you, O mortal, what is good; and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?"* In "The Message," this verse reads this way: *"But he's already made it plain how to live, what to do, what God is looking for in men and women. It's quite simple: Do what is fair and just to your neighbor, be compassionate and loyal in your love, And don't take yourself too seriously— take God seriously."*



This verse suggests some serious spiritual questions we might ask ourselves in these anxious and challenging times are:
► How am I to come before the Lord? ► How can I deepen my spiritual life, my spiritual practices? ► If I say I am a Christian and a follower of Jesus Christ, what then shall I do? ► Indeed, what is expected of me?

In worship during the six Sundays, May 26-June 30, 2013, we will explore how this verse of scripture can be our vision and mission for the future and how we might deepen our spiritual connections to ourselves, to each other and to the community and world.
